

# Preoperative hair removal

Procedure of hair removal with clipper



## **Critical points**

1. Hair interferes with surgery.

### Action:

- Only hair interfering with the surgical procedure should be removed.
- 2. Infection due to skin abrasion after shaving.

### Action:

- Hair removal should only be performed the day of surgery in a location outside the operating or procedure room.
- Hair should be clipped using a single-use electric or batteryoperated clipper or a clipper with a reusable head that can be disinfected between surgical operations. Shaving with razors is not recommended.

## Note

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Only remove hair interfering with the surgical procedure, just before surgery.

### **Procedure**

This is a suggested procedure. Please follow the guidelines and instructions of your hospital.

- 1. Prepare material:
  - Clipper
  - Removable head for clipper
  - Paper towel
  - Tape
  - Pair of gloves

## Note

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Stroke against direction of hair growth.

Remove clipped hair.

Disinfect hands.



- 2. Inform the patient (if they are awake) that you will shave the surgical area.
- 3. Install the anesthetic frame.
- 4. Disinfect your hands.
- 5. Put on gloves.
- 6. Place the paper towel under the area of hair removal.
- 7. Check the skin condition for injuries.
- 8. If required, draw an incision line on the skin.
- 9. Clipping: Use short strokes in the opposite direction of hair growth. Hair stubble will still be present after clipping.
- 10. Remove all clipped hair with a tape or other adhesive products to prevent contamination of the surgical site.
- 11. Check the surgical site.
- 12. Remove all paper tissues carefully. Make sure that no hair contaminates the surroundings.
- 13. Remove all used material. Disinfect clippers and table or trolley.
  - Discard the disposable clipper head into a sharps container.
- 14. Remove gloves and disinfect hands.
