Learning outcomes:

Task 2.1: Read the booklet "How people learn"

Purpose: after reading the booklet, you should be able to

- Define learning
- Demonstrate the learning cycle
- Describe learning domains, styles, and types of adult learners
- Identify the learning experiences that will produce the highest rates of learner retention
- Outline the 7 principles of teaching for learning
- Write meaningful learning outcome statements
- Plan and structure a learning session
- Reflect on how feedback can be used to improve learning

Task: Read the booklet and make notes if necessary, eg, the concept on page 6 (learning pyramid) will be used during our online discussion.

Task 2.2: Complete the eModule "How people learn"
